The Queen's Platinum Jubilee - 2-5 June 2022

The Parish Council is currently in early stage discussions about ways in which the whole community can come together to celebrate The Queen's Platinum Jubilee from Thursday 2 June - Sunday 5 June (inclusive) next year.

As you may be aware, a comprehensive Programme of Events was arranged in 2012 to celebrate the Queen's Diamond Jubilee in the Village, and it is hoped that this can be repeated.

Whilst only initial discussions have taken place, the Littlehampton District Lions Club has already provisionally agreed to hold the Annual Rustington Street Fayre on Saturday 4 June 2022. Other events that might form part of the celebrations include a Prom Concert in the Village Memorial Hall hosted by Littlehampton Concert Band, a Funfair and a Fun Day on the Woodlands Recreation Ground.

The Council is anxious that as many members of the local community as possible should be involved in deciding how this most important Event should be celebrated in the Village and, with this in mind, a Meeting was held recently in the Village Memorial Hall at The Woodlands Centre, which was attended by representatives from local Groups, Clubs, Organisations and Businesses.

Rustington Museum

It has been a busy couple of months at the Museum as preparation continues for the next Temporary Exhibition, the "Shops of Rustington", which will be open by the time you read this article! There have been some lovely donations to help with the displays. We are still looking for information about the old shops in the Village and people's memories to help complete a Museum database. Please contact the Museum at: museum@rustingtonpc.org with memories and any possible donations or loans.

Also on display for August will be a case celebrating Owen Electrical, filled with photos and objects on loan from Christine Broomfield, whose family ran the shop from when it first opened. This will be followed in September by a display of the photographic skills of Gordon Howlett, who owned Rustington Cameras. He took photographs on many different subjects as the case will show.

Going on permanent display in the Museum soon will be two pub signs, The Smugglers Roost and The Windmill. These will be displayed in the Local Studies area, accompanied by information regarding their history. The pub signs have been conserved with the aid of a grant from the AIM Pilgrim Trust Conservation Scheme and in partnership with the Rustington Heritage Association.


West Sussex Transport Plan 2022-2036

West Sussex County Council is reviewing the West Sussex Transport Plan (WSTP) to update its approach to investment in, and management of, the transport network for the period 2022-2036. Transport affects every aspect of our lives including how we work, socialise, access education and health services. We must plan for our future transport needs in order to protect and enhance our beautiful and prosperous County.

The draft West Sussex Transport Plan sets out how the County Council

intends to address challenges including a growing and ageing population, transport emissions and climate change, rural isolation, public health and wellbeing, congestion and road safety. Rampion 2 Wind Farm
The Consultation on draft proposals for a development to expand the Rampion Offshore Wind Farm is open from 14 July to 16 September 2021.

An 'Area of Search' eight miles off the Sussex coast has been assessed by renewable energy producer RWE for a maximum of up to 116 turbines, the same number as the existing Rampion Wind Farm but using the latest turbine technology, so that the Rampion 2 Wind Farm could create up to three times the amount of power. An underground cable route is proposed to carry the power under Climping Beach to Bolney Substation in Twineham, to connect to the National Grid via a new substation required close by.
