MINUTES: of the Monthly Meeting held on 26 January 2026

1/26 APOLOGIES FOR ABSENCE

An apology for absence was received from Councillor Ms Revell (Holiday). This apology was accepted by the Council.

2/26 RESIGNATION - COUNCILLOR MRS VALERIE ALLEN

The Chairman reported the receipt of a letter of resignation from Councillor Mrs Allen with effect from 13 January 2026.

He confirmed that Councillor Mrs Allen's decision to resign was mainly due to her now more extensive commitment to the operation of the Littlehampton Community Fridge, together with her desire to dedicate more time to her family. She had advised that both of these factors meant that she could no longer devote sufficient time and effort to the Council.

He said that in her letter, Councillor Mrs Allen had said that she had thoroughly enjoyed her time as a Parish Councillor, and had been proud to be a part of such a progressive Council. She had also recorded her thanks to all of the Councillors for their friendship and support throughout her time as a Member of the Council. She had also expressed her appreciation to all Members of the Council's staff for their help and assistance.

The Chairman expressed his personal thanks to Councillor Mrs Allen for her commitment and efforts during her time as a Member of the Council for the benefit of the community of Rustington.

The Council NOTED this information with sadness, but understanding, and recorded its appreciation to Councillor Mrs Allen for her commitment to the Council.

It was also AGREED that the Chairman should write to Councillor Mrs Allen, on behalf of the Council, conveying its appreciation for her commitment, hard work and efforts during her time as a Member.

The Clerk advised that arrangements would now be made, at the appropriate time, for this vacancy in the West Ward to be advertised on all of the Council's Notice Boards throughout the Village, and on the Council's Website, giving members of the public an opportunity to claim a By-Election.

She reminded the Council that if a By-Election was not called for by the due closing date, she would make arrangements for this vacancy to be advertised for filling via the co-option process.

3/26 DECLARATIONS OF INTEREST

There were no declarations of interest by Members.

4/26 MINUTES

The Minutes of the Meeting held on 24 November 2025 were signed by the Chairman as a correct record.

An apology for absence had been received from PCSO Raju.

(a) Matters Arising

The Clerk referred to Minute 286/25(a) and said that there had been a number of representations received during December and January regarding the increase in the number of individuals actively begging in the centre of the Village.

She said that reports had been made to the Anti-Social Behaviour Team at the Arun District Council, and to PCSO Raju, initially by the Deputy Clerk and more recently by herself.

The Anti-Social Behaviour Team had advised that the Police and CPO's (Community Protection Officers) had been visiting the sites in the Village, together with other sites locally, to try and ID the individuals, and also to give advice regarding begging.

She then advised that following her representation regarding two individuals, who were begging outside of Tesco Express and The Original Factory Shop, to the Anti-Social Behaviour Team earlier in the month, she had been advised that the Community Protection Officers were aware of this and would be ensuring that the Village Centre would form part of their patrols. She said that as far as she was aware, there had been no reports received of individuals begging in the Village for the past week or so, although on enquiring with a local retail outlet, she had been told that one of the aforementioned individuals had been present outside of The Original Factory Shop on one occasion at the beginning of the previous week.

The Chairman reported that the same individual had been present outside of The Original Factory Shop on Friday 23 January 2026.

Councillor Lee then advised that the published November crime figures numbered 65 of which the majority were anti-social behaviour incidents, particularly in the Eastern Ward. He advised there had been no reported burglaries.

He said that the December figures stated 56 crimes of which 34 were anti-social behaviour incidents.

He also advised that the figures so far in the current month numbered 42, of which 50% were anti-social behaviour crimes.

He concluded by reporting that for the three-month period from November, no residential burglaries had been reported.

Councillor Bennett then reported on the Police 'Ride-A-Long' day, where he had accompanied a Police Patrol for the day on 7 December 2025. He said that the day had been most interesting, but it was evident to him that there was a significant shortfall of frontline resources in the Arun District in particular, and at least half of the day had been spent in Chichester. He said that there was a long wait for Officers to be trained in driving at speed and taser training, which was concerning to note. He expressed his thanks and appreciation to Sergeant Powell for arranging the day.

The Clerk concluded by advising that the Police Bike Marking Event in The Woodlands Centre Car Park had taken place on 5 January 2026. She said that the Deputy Clerk had assisted PCSO Raju by promoting the Event on Facebook, and he had been very pleased that 20 people had turned up during the one-hour slot.

The Council NOTED the above information.

(b) Arun All Parishes Meeting - 18 November 2025

The Council NOTED the Report of the Meeting held on 18 November 2025 from Inspector Ross Wickings. A copy is attached and forms a part of these Minutes.

6/26 DISTRICT COUNCILLORS

Apologies for absence had been received from Councillors Ms Edwards.

Councillor Gunner then reported on District Council matters as follows:-

- *Changes to Waste Collection Services - New waste bins should be delivered to households in Rustington as follows:-*

Monday Collections - 23 February to 6 March

Tuesday Collections - 10 February to 20 February

New food bins

Monday Collections - Week commencing 9 March

Tuesday Collections - Week commencing 16 March

New Services to be launched in April 2026 - Residents can opt out of having new bins

- *Housing Stock - Rated C4 Grade - One of the worst in the Country - Housing Improvement Board set up of which Councillor Gunner was a member - Future ownership of housing stock, taking account of Local Government Re-organisation not yet known but would probably be implemented over a period of time*
- *Local Government Re-organisation - County Council Elections postponed for the current year - Parish Council Elections to be held in 2027 - Government to make decision in March as to the Option adopted for Sussex, which will go through Government in the Summer - Until then no certainty on boundaries, electoral divisions, etc - Section 41 Notice will be issued - Whereby the District Council will only be able to provide general services with no new projects*
- *£250,000 allocated by District Council to Littlehampton, Bognor and Arundel for Town Centre Action Plans - Hopeful that from April, Rustington might be invited to join the Business Crime Reduction Partnership*
- *The Wave Leisure Centre Temporary Closure - Due to Fire Alarm failure*
- *2026/2027 Budget - Likely to be maximum increase.*

Councillor Gunner then responded to questions from Members on issues covered in his Report.

The Council NOTED the above information and the Chairman thanked Councillor Gunner for his Report.

7/26 COUNTY COUNCILLORS

Councillor Mrs Cooper, in her capacity as a County Councillor, reported on County Council matters as follows:-

- *Local Government Reorganisation - 2026 Elections postponed - Section 41 Notice means no vast changes/major decisions can be made/new projects commenced*

- *2026/2027 Budget to be considered and agreed at next Full Council Meeting on 20 February 2026.*

Councillor Mrs Cooper then responded to questions from Members.

The Council NOTED the above information and the Chairman thanked Councillor Mrs Cooper for her Report.

8/26 CLERK'S REPORT

(a) 2022 Halloween Street Fayre - Donation

The Clerk reported the receipt of a letter of thanks and appreciation from the Twins Trust for the donation of £895.00 from the proceeds of the 2022 Halloween Street Fayre.

The Council was pleased to NOTE this information.

9/26 CHAIRMAN'S REPORT

The Chairman said that he had not represented the Council at any Meetings, Events or Functions since the last Monthly Meeting.

He then advised that, along with the Vice-Chairman, he would be attending the opening of the Aydo Restaurant in the Village on 28 January 2026. He said that he would report back to the Council on this Event at the next Meeting.

The Council NOTED this information.

10/26 PLANNING COMMITTEE

The Council NOTED the Reports of the Planning Committee Meetings held on 27 October 2025, 1 December 2025 and 15 December 2025.

11/26 FINANCE AND GENERAL PURPOSES COMMITTEE

(a) Report of Meeting held on 15 December 2025

The Council received the Report of the Finance and General Purposes Committee Meeting held on 15 December 2025.

The Council RESOLVED that the Report of the Finance and General Purposes Committee Meeting held on 15 December 2025 be APPROVED.

Councillor Warren provided a summary of the reasoning for the increase in the Precept, explaining that as there was a much-increased budget for the new financial year, the Council's reserve had had to be increased. He advised that the tax base had decreased, due to a drop in the number of Council Tax paying households, which had added just over half of one per cent to all Precept calculations.

He said that, looking forward, the Committee was also concerned on two points. Firstly, whether the lettings budget in 2026/2027 would be achieved, being mindful of the major disturbances that might be suffered as a result of The Woodlands Centre Refurbishment Project, and secondly, that as a result of the late commencement of the Project, whether the costs would be subject to inflationary pressures.

He advised that, taking account of the above information, the Finance and General Purposes Committee had recommended that the Precept for 2026/2027 should be set at £825,000.00, which represented an increase of 5.53% on the current year. This would provide an additional £22,000.00 above the Council's Budget requirements.

He concluded by stating that the percentage increase would be in line with that of the West Sussex County Council, and that the Parish Council's share of the Council Tax was just over 5% of the overall cost.

The Council NOTED this information.

(b) Precept - 2026/2027

The Council AUTHORISED the issue of the Precept on the Arun District Council in the sum of £825,000.00 for 2026/2027.

(c) Report of Meeting held on 26 January 2026

The Council received the Report of the Finance and General Purposes Committee Meeting held on 26 January 2026. (Verbal Report from the Chairman of the Committee).

The Council RESOLVED that the Report of the Finance and General Purposes Committee Meeting held on 26 January 2026 be APPROVED.

12/26 ANNUAL ASSEMBLY OF THE PARISH MEETING - 9 APRIL 2026

The Clerk referred to Minute 294/25 and said that this matter had been deferred from the November Monthly Council Meeting for further consideration at this Meeting.

Following a further discussion, the Council RESOLVED that Mrs Alison Griffiths, MP should be invited to attend the Annual Assembly of the Parish Meeting, as the Guest Speaker, on 9 April 2026.

13/26 THE WOODLANDS CENTRE - MAJOR REDESIGN AND REFURBISHMENT PROJECT

The Council NOTED the Summary Notes of the Design Workshops held on 27 November 2025 and 18 December 2025.

The Clerk then said that the next Design Workshop was due to be held on 12 February 2026.

The Council NOTED this information.

14/26 REVIEW OF YOUTH PROVISION

The Clerk referred to Minute 297/25 and said that as far as youth provision was concerned, the Youth Centre was now accommodating the Littlehampton Army Cadets for one session per week, but this was due to increase to two sessions per week in the next month or so. She said that she had received a proposal for the Youth Table Tennis Club and it was hoped that a Meeting to discuss this, which covered a launch event/taster session followed by a one night per week term time Club, together with a possible HAF style School Holiday Camp, would be taking place in the next week or so. She said that she would report back to the Council further in this regard as soon as a firm arrangement had been agreed.

She then referred to other use of the Youth Centre and advised that the Activ8 Nursery was now fully operational for the entire Centre five days per week, with two other regular weekend weekly hirers, and some ad-hoc/one-off hirings, normally at weekends.

Taking account of the above, there was still availability for additional youth activities on three weekday evenings.

Councillor Mrs Stevens then reported in her capacity as a Member of the Review of Youth Provision Working Party, on progress made, with Councillors from Angmering and East Preston Parish Councils,

on seeking the views of pupils from a selection of the local Primary Schools in respect of what activities they would be interested to participate in out-of-school time, etc.

She advised that the information gathered from the above exercise had been considered by representatives from the above-mentioned Councils, herself and the Deputy Clerk at a Meeting held on 17 December 2025. She said that from the pupils' views obtained, it had become clear that the provision of information relating to what activities/facilities were available for young people locally, was important, and an App providing such information would, most certainly be a great asset. She said that as this was proving to be very difficult to provide, the possibility of a Web Page being set up containing the type of information sought after by young people, was being looked into.

She concluded by saying that she would report back to the Council on further progress made in this regard.

The Council was pleased to NOTE this information.

15/26 RUSTINGTON IN-BLOOM

The Council NOTED the Minutes of the Meeting held on 14 January 2026.

Councillor Lee then elaborated on the matters covered in the Minutes, including reminding the Council that the next Litter Pick at the Woodlands Recreation Ground would be taking place on 7 February 2026, and the Committee would also be having a table at the Littlehampton Community Fridge Charities' Monthly Market at the Methodist Church on 7 March 2026.

The Council was pleased to NOTE this information.

16/26 75TH ANNIVERSARY OF THE FESTIVAL OF BRITAIN MUSICAL CONCERT - 13 JUNE 2026

The Clerk referred to Minute 299/25 and reminded the Council that the Summer Musical Concert to commemorate the 75th Anniversary of the Festival of Britain would be taking place on the afternoon of 13 June 2026 (2.30 pm start time) in the Village Memorial Hall.

She advised that the Conductor of the Band was already working on the Programme and, as in previous years, entry would be free of charge, but with tickets being obtained in advance from the Samuel Wickens Centre. She said that cold refreshments would be supplied by the Council to the seated audience, with a Lucky Programme Draw and Retiring Collection for the Chairman's Chosen Charity being included.

She then referred to the Council's previous donations to the Band in recognition of its major contribution to special occasion/commemorative/celebratory event Concerts, and asked the Council to again consider making a financial donation to the Band towards its operational costs.

The Council NOTED this information and RESOLVED that a donation of £300.00 should be made to the Littlehampton Concert Band in the next financial year, to demonstrate its thanks and appreciation of the Band's continued support for the benefit of the community of Rustington.

17/26 FUTURE OF ZACHARY MERTON HOSPITAL AND LAND

The Clerk reminded Members that she had previously circulated correspondence between the Chairman and Mike Jennings, Deputy Chief Executive, Sussex Community NHS Foundation Trust, including a Press Release issued by the Council and a letter to the Chairman from the Chairman of Angmering Parish Council.

The Chairman then reported on the informal Meeting held on 16 January 2026. He said that the Meeting had considered the draft to the letter received from Mr Mike Jennings, Deputy Chief Executive, Sussex Community NHS Foundation Trust, dated 9 January 2026 and the Meeting had agreed that it should be sent to Mr Jennings. It was also agreed that a letter received from the Chairman of the Angmering Parish Council supporting the Council's initial letter to Mr Jennings, should be enclosed with the aforementioned letter.

He advised that following a further in-depth debate on the best way forward/next steps, the Meeting had agreed that the following proposals should be placed before Council for consideration and anticipated approval:-

1. A pack containing all relevant correspondence should be forwarded to West Sussex County Council to be considered by the Health and Social Care Scrutiny Committee's Business Planning Group on 11 February 2026, as the closure of Zachary Merton Hospital was already on the Agenda for consideration
2. Copies of all correspondence with Mr Jennings, including the notes of the Meeting held on 17 July 2025 with Mr Jennings and Ms Hannah Duce, Associate Director of Communications and Engagement, Sussex Community NHS Foundation Trust, Members and Personnel from the Parish Council and District Councillor Gunner, should be forwarded to the Integrated Care Board for consideration
3. To investigate the possibility of a Public Meeting
4. Press Releases to be issued with updated information, as the situation evolves
5. To continue to lobby for Public Consultation to be undertaken by the appropriate NHS Trust
6. Petition registered by Councillor Bennett with Government, to be held in abeyance at the present time.

Following a detailed discussion, the Council RESOLVED that all of the above proposals should be APPROVED and, in addition:-

- A letter should be sent to the Secretary of State, requesting that the sale be halted, so that options for other NHS much needed facilities on the site could be considered, e.g. a Neighbourhood Health Centre or similar facility. The letter to include all of the correspondence with Mr Jennings to date, including Meeting Notes and any other relevant information.

Councillor Bennett then provided an update on the Freedom of Information request that he had submitted to the NHS in December 2024 regarding the Survey that had been undertaken at Zachary Merton Site. He reminded Members that he had been unsatisfied with the lack of information that he had originally received and had requested Mr Jennings to look into this at the Meeting he had attended to address the Council in July 2025.

He said that Mr Jennings had finally responded to him on 8 January 2026, and had advised as follows:-

‘At the time of this request, Sussex Community NHS Foundation Trust (SCFT) had not received the survey report from the supplier and therefore did not hold the information requested. This information is now held by SCFT, however this information is exempted under section 43 (2) of the FOI Act 2000 which provides an exemption based on likelihood to prejudice the commercial interests of any person(s) including those of the Trust and our suppliers.’

Following a further brief discussion, it was also AGREED that that the email correspondence between Councillor Bennett and Mr Jennings in connection with the aforementioned Freedom of Information Request should also be included with the letter to the Secretary of State.

18/26 ARUN DISTRICT COUNCIL - LOCAL GOVERNMENT REORGANISATION - PROPOSALS - CONSULTATION

(a) Town and Parish Briefing - 18 December 2025

The Council NOTED an email received from Dawn Hudd, Chief Executive, together with associated documentation in this regard.

A copy of the slides that were presented at the Briefing, which included details of the option put forward to the Government by the West Sussex District and Borough Councils for a two unitary option for the County and the one unitary option for the West Sussex County Council, together with the timeline for key milestones going forward is attached and forms a part of these Minutes.

The Clerk said the Deputy Clerk had represented the Council at this Meeting.

(b) Local Government Re-organisation in West Sussex - Consultation now closed

The Council NOTED the latest information received from Dawn Hudd, Chief Executive, in this regard. A copy of this Shaping West Sussex Update is attached and forms a part of these Minutes.

The Council NOTED this information.

19/26 ARUN DISTRICT COUNCIL - FORTHCOMING CHANGES TO ARUN'S WASTE COLLECTION SERVICES

The Council NOTED an email received from Joe Russell-Wells, Group Head of Environment & Climate Change, as follows:-

Further to my email to you on 7th November 2025 detailing forthcoming changes to Arun's waste collection services, I write with a further update.

Residents will have received a copy of the Arun Times in early November providing details of the changes to collection services, including the introduction of weekly food waste collections in April. The first major milestone in implementing these changes is the distribution of 180 litre wheeled general waste bins to the majority of households which will commence on the 5th January 2026 (please note that communal properties, HMO's, flats and those properties which have unique collection arrangements will be dealt with separately). The distribution of these bins is being undertaken on a collection day basis as illustrated in the table below.

Residents should have received the attached postcard between early - mid December in anticipation of this. To supplement this postcard the Council have been putting out various social media posts with information. Thank you to those of you that have shared this via your own social media channels so far, please do continue to share these communications to ensure that they reach as wide an audience as possible.

Bin hangers (also attached for reference) will be placed on the bins signposting residents to the opt out option (NB this is only opting out of receiving a new 180 litre wheeled general waste bin if they already have a 180 litre or smaller wheeled general waste bin) or requesting collection of their old, unwanted bin.

All information including the opt out and unwanted bin collection e-forms are available via www.arun.gov.uk/simpler-recycling. Additional Arun contact centre advisors are available to answer any questions residents may have and support them in completing these forms on 01903 737754.

Further social media posts, media publications, radio advertising and other communications will continue between the new year and launch of the new services in April.

20/26 ARUN DISTRICT COUNCIL - TOWN AND PARISH COUNCIL'S CLIMATE CHANGE GROUP MEETING - 5 FEBRUARY 2026 - BIODIVERSITY FOCUS

The Clerk reminded Members that she had previously circulated an email received from Jonathan Letendrie, Project Support Officer, Climate Change, advising that the next Meeting of the District Council's Climate Change Group would be taking place on 5 February 2026 from 1.30 pm to 3.00 pm on Microsoft Teams.

In his email, he said that the Meeting would be focused on the actions Parish and Town Councils could take to support biodiversity, and would include a talk and Q&A by the District Council's Ecology Officer.

Following a brief discussion the Council RESOLVED that Councillor Mrs Stevens should represent the Council at the aforementioned Meeting.

21/26 WEST SUSSEX COUNTY COUNCIL - LOCAL GOVERNMENT REVIEW - GOVERNMENT'S CONSULTATION ON PROPOSALS FOR LOCAL GOVERNMENT REORGANISATION IN WEST SUSSEX

The Council NOTED an email received from Paul Marshall, Leader, regarding the Government's Consultation on proposals for Local Government Re-organisation in West Sussex.

In his email Mr Marshall advised that the County Council was supporting a single unitary option for West Sussex as it scored highest overall within the shared West Sussex business case and best met the Government's criteria, particularly in relation to it being the right size to achieve efficiencies, improve capacity and withstand financial shocks and the ability to prioritise the delivery of long-term high quality public services.

22/26 WEST SUSSEX COUNTY COUNCIL - 2025 HIGHWAYS BRIEFINGS

The Council NOTED an email received from Zoe Capel, Highways Customer Service Manager, advising that she had collated all the 2025 Highways Briefings and had included details and links to the recordings and slides for each session as follows:-
