MINUTES: of the Monthly Meeting held on 27 April 2026

92/26 APOLOGIES FOR ABSENCE

Apologies for absence were received from Councillors Mrs Gregory (Holiday), Grevett (Personal), Lee (Indisposition) and Ms Lloyd (Personal). These apologies were accepted by the Council.

93/26 DECLARATIONS OF INTEREST

Councillor Cooper declared a personal interest in Minute 114/26. He remained in the Meeting during consideration of this item.

94/26 MINUTES

The Minutes of the Monthly Meeting held on 23 March 2026 were signed by the Chairman as a correct record.

95/26 ANNUAL ASSEMBLY OF THE PARISH MEETING

The Council NOTED the Minutes of the Annual Assembly of the Parish Meeting held on 9 April 2026.

96/26 CASUAL VACANCY

The Clerk referred to Minute 67/26 and said that she had previously circulated an application received from a candidate for the Casual Vacancy in the West Ward.

The Chairman then invited the applicant who was present at the Meeting, namely Mr Street, to make a brief personal presentation to the Council.

The Meeting was adjourned at this juncture, and Mr Street, together with members of the Public left the Meeting.

The Council then considered the Presentation, alongside the written application received.

Members of the Council were each given a voting paper to complete. These papers were then collected and checked by the Deputy Clerk, in attendance at the Meeting.

The Chairman then declared that by a unanimous vote, Mr Street was the successful candidate.

The Meeting resumed at this juncture and Mr Street and the Public were invited to re-join the Meeting.

The Council then RESOLVED that by a unanimous vote, Mr Street be co-opted to the Council to fill the vacancy in the West Ward.

The Chairman then thanked Mr Street for attending the Meeting and addressing the Council.

An apology for absence had been received from PCSO Raju.

(a) Matters Arising

The Clerk reported on her attendance, along with the Deputy Clerk and District Councillors Mrs Cooper and Gunner, at a Meeting with the Community Safety Manager and the Community and Well-Being Manager, Arun District Council, regarding a recent rise in youth related anti-social behaviour incidents in Rustington.

She said that both of the above-mentioned District Council Managers had advised that a spate of criminal incidents had occurred during January 2026, with the perpetrators being a group of up to 10 youths. The incidents had, in the main, been at two key locations outside of the Village Centre. They said that a number of the youths had been identified and the Anti-Social Behaviour Team had made contact with their parents, and anti-social behaviour contracts were in the process of being issued. They confirmed that no further incidents had been reported.

The Clerk then relayed a Report she had received from Councillor Lee, as follows:-

'There were 61 reported crimes in February, including one burglary in Sea Avenue (details unknown), one robbery near Waitrose (details unknown) and 20 cases of ASB. PCSO Raju has advised that for this month, up to 23 April, there have been 42 crimes reported, of which 26 were ASB. He has also reported that the suspect for the Tesco Express break-in has been arrested and is awaiting a court date. Apparently the second suspect has not been identified.'

Councillor Ceiriog-Hughes then reported that a shoplifter had been arrested the previous day at the Co-op Store in Station Parade.

Councillor Mrs Cooper advised that the Police were now involved with the ongoing issue, which was, in effect, a legal matter, between property owners in Church Road and a business in Woodlands Avenue.

The Council NOTED this information.

(b) Arun All Parishes Meetings - 27 March 2026 and 27 April 2026

The Deputy Clerk reported that she had attended the Meeting, hosted by Inspector Ross Wickings, on 27 March 2026.

She said that Inspector Wickings had provided information on the Police Operation as follows:-

Force Wide Matters

Response to Crowborough Barracks situation has drawn many Sergeants and PC's away from the NPT - it has impacted daily resources in terms of available personnel locally. It is quietening down now

Neighbourhood Police Programme - A way of delivering professionalism in local policing, includes matters such as standardising the Forces approach to ASB. Whilst Officers etc. are training this will also impact the availability of resources

ASB Action Plan - A Government Directive - every Force has to have one. Not a publicly shared document.

Divisionally

Coaching Unit is now recruiting. The initiative should have the potential to increase Police resources locally.

Locally

All Sergeants now in place

There has been some minimal relocation of PCSO's to ensure even spread of support. New cohorts coming through.

The Council NOTED this information.

The Clerk then advised that she had attended the Meeting, hosted by Inspector Ross Wickings, on 27 April 2026.

She said that Inspector Wickings had again provided information on the Police Operation as follows:-

Force Wide Matters

Response to Epsom Protest situation has drawn many Sergeants and PC's away from the NPT - Adversely affected resources in connection with personnel locally

District Engagement Officer - Decision made that role will move closer to Headquarters - Will mean less contact with Neighbourhood Policing Team.

Divisionally

Nothing particular to report at the present time, although various initiatives, etc., ongoing

Forthcoming Elections having an impact on engagement - No photographs of Candidates standing for Election permitted, etc.

Locally

Incidents of racial graffiti recently - one incident in Barnham and two in Littlehampton - Public need to be urged to report any incidents that they witness

Work now being undertaken around Station Square in Bognor - Very early days at the moment

Two PCs coming to join Team - One going to Bognor, One to Littlehampton

Neighbourhood Policing being looked at and the local Team now being guaranteed an additional Sergeant post - Hoping to fill that post to probably cover Arun and Chichester

Mobile Engagement Pod - Now delivered and in the process of being wrapped, and training being arranged - First place to deploy may be Bognor - Three-month trial.

Questions then asked/Issues raised by a number of Councils in respect of:-

- *Graffiti in Bognor*
- *Recent Illegal Encampments in District - Groups well behaved with no issues - Now moved on District Council responsibility for the Management of Travellers now moved to Well-Being and Communities Department*
- *Car driven into Kebab Shop in Bersted on 26 April 2026*
- *Criminal damage incidents at Mayflower Park, Angmering - One floodlight broken in half and another couple of associated incidents including a small fire and Council personnel being subjected to verbal abuse when clearing up damage*

- *Recent arrest in Littlehampton of male by 6 or 7 Police Officers - Culprit from Littlehampton - Incident began with Sergeant attempting to confiscate alcohol - Resulting in arrest for various reasons*
- *Number of community events in Littlehampton - Generally no anti-social behaviour issues - Vast improvement*
- *Some anti-social behaviour/criminal damage incidents around Pagham Village Hall - Damage to fence*
- *Continuing issue with speeding cars - Pagham Road*
- *Serious Parking Problem, Hook Lane*
- *Recent reports of Youth in balaclavas on electric scooter/bike harassing customers in Fish and Chip Shop on corner of Rose Green Road and Park Avenue*
- *Two full time Community Patrol Officers now on Anti-Social Behaviour Team*
- *Rough Sleeping increasing - If witnessed, members of the public should report via Street Link so that a referral is actioned.*

The Council NOTED this information.

98/26 DISTRICT COUNCILLORS

Apologies for absence had been received from Councillors Ms Edwards and Gunner.

Councillor Mrs Cooper then reported on District Council matters as follows:-

- *New Waste Collection Services - Still very busy at end of the second week of the new services - Response good - Approximately 200 tons of food waste collected - Teething problems with some bin collections still being missed - Work being done over the weekend to catch up - Communication is going out via website, social media and the Arun app - With missed food waste collections, residents being asked to be patient and wait for their next scheduled collection*

Initially, in certain cases waste and recycling services have been remodelled to ensure balanced rounds over the two-week period, the wait for some properties will amount to three weeks for a recycling collection. This was unavoidable and residents were advised of this

Number of calls to Advisors continue to be high, but numbers are dropping

Biffa personnel working hard to manage this huge project roll out

The number of the Arun App downloads nearing 25,000 - 5,000 above target set for period

- *Rustington Recycling Centre (Waitrose Car Park) - Fly Tipping and general overload of rubbish - Cleared by Biffa almost immediately after report received.*

The Council NOTED the above information and the Chairman thanked Councillor Mrs Cooper for her Report.

99/26 COUNTY COUNCILLORS

Councillor Mrs Cooper, in her capacity as a County Councillor, reported on County Council matters as follows:-

- *No Meetings to report on due to forthcoming Election on 7 May 2026*
- *Still receiving and dealing with many representations on issues including speeding, parking, potholes, particularly on private land - Parish Council might need to look at requesting Traffic Regulation Orders, etc., after Election.*

The Council NOTED the above information and the Chairman thanked Councillor Mrs Cooper for her Report. He also thanked her for all of her hard work over the past four years as the County Councillor responsible for the majority of Rustington.

100/26 CLERK'S REPORT

(a) Woodlands Table Tennis Club

The Clerk reported the receipt of a letter of thanks and appreciation from Woodlands Table Tennis Club in respect of the reduction in Hall Hire costs for a further 12 months, effective from 1 April 2026.

The Council was pleased to NOTE this information.

101/26 CHAIRMAN'S REPORT

The Chairman said that he had nothing to report at the present time, as far as attendance at any events, but expressed his concern that for the first time in many years, the Chairman of the Parish Council had not been invited to the Arundel and Littlehampton Scout District St George's Day Parade/Service in Arundel.

Following a brief discussion, the Council RESOLVED that its disappointment should be conveyed to the appropriate person at the Arundel and Littlehampton Scout District, particularly as Rustington had the largest Scout Group in the District.

102/26 PLANNING COMMITTEE

The Council NOTED the Reports of the Planning Committee Meetings held on 16 March 2026 and 13 April 2026.

103/26 FINANCE AND GENERAL PURPOSES COMMITTEE

The Council received the Report of the Finance and General Purposes Committee Meeting held on 27 April 2026. (Verbal Report from the Chairman of the Committee).

The Council RESOLVED that the Recommendations contained in the Report of the Finance and General Purposes Committee Meeting held on 27 April 2026 be APPROVED.

104/26 MEMBERS' ATTENDANCE RECORD

The Council NOTED the Attendance Record for Council and Committee Meetings for the period from April 2025 to March 2026 inclusive.

105/26 REVIEW OF INSURANCE PROVISION

The Clerk reported that the Finance Manager/RFO and herself had again reviewed the Council's Insurance provision and whilst the current situation was that the Council continued to be over-insured in certain areas, the Finance Manager/RFO and herself remained of the opinion that the total provision was more than sufficient to cover all losses in the event of any unforeseen incidents.

She reminded the Council that Meetings were held with the Council's Insurance Brokers on at least an annual basis, when additions, amendments and deletions were periodically made. She confirmed that the Finance Manager/RFO and herself were also in regular contact with the Brokers.

She then advised that there had not been any claims during the past financial year.

The Council NOTED this information and RESOLVED unanimously that no major changes were required to be made to the insurance provision at the present time.

106/26 PARISHIONERS' AWARD

The Clerk reported that two nominations (four nominators) for the individual award had been received, and two nominations (four nominators) for the group/organisation award. She said that a Meeting of the Working Party would now need to be convened to consider the nominations received, and possibly the unsuccessful nominations for the previous year.

Following a brief discussion, the Council AGREED that a Meeting of the appointed Members of the Working Party, namely Councillors Mrs Broomfield, Broomfield, Mrs Cooper, Mrs P Gregory, Mrs Partridge, Ms M Revell and Rogers, should be held on 14 May 2026 at 10.00 am, to consider the nominations received.

107/26 THE WOODLANDS CENTRE - MAJOR REDESIGN AND REFURBISHMENT PROJECT

The Clerk referred to Minute 76/26 and reminded Members that she had previously circulated a Report of the Meeting of the Working Party held on 13 April 2026, as follows:-

1. *Ms Costan, Mrs Harris and Mrs Ward reported on their attendance at a Meeting with the Project Managers and Quantity Surveyor on 24 March 2026, in respect of the Tender Strategy and Phasing of the Project. A copy of the email from the Project Managers containing the Meeting Summary, together with associated attachments, is attached for information.*

2. *Following a detailed discussion, the Working Party is RECOMMENDING that:-*

Scenario One should be opted for and progressed, in respect of notifying affected hirers of the Village Memorial Hall in the first instance, without delay. As opting for this Scenario is likely to have cost implications, hirers of facilities in the rear section of the Centre should not be advised of the proposed closure period until such time as the additional costs are known and have been considered by the Council. This is anticipated to be May/June 2026, once the completed Pre-Qualification Questionnaires have been received and considered.

3. *The temporary storage requirements during the construction works were then considered in detail, and the Working Party is also RECOMMENDING that:-*

A garage located near to the Centre, should be rented on a temporary basis at a cost of approximately £21.00 per week. Other storage requirements to be facilitated in various other Council facilities, if practicably possible. If, however, it becomes evident that there is a need for a temporary storage space, then storage unit/s (porta-cabins) will need to be hired to cover the construction period.

4. *The Clerk advised the Working Party that if Scenario One was the preferred way forward then it would be necessary to arrange alternative accommodation for all Council Meetings for the duration of the works to the rear section of the Centre, with effect from 4 January 2026. It was noted that the Samuel Wickens Centre was currently available on Wednesday and Thursday evenings, and she would be making contact with all Members to obtain their preferences, in the near future.*

Following a further detailed discussion, the Council NOTED the Report of the Working Party and RESOLVED that the Recommendations contained therein should be APPROVED.

Councillor Warren raised the possibility of including the reconfiguration/refurbishment of the Roger Montgomeri Room in the first stage of the Project, when the works to the Village Memorial Hall would be being undertaken. The Clerk said that she would discuss the logistics of this with the Project Managers and report back to the Council at the next Meeting.

108/26 **RUSTINGTON IN-BLOOM**

On behalf of Councillor Lee, the Clerk reported that the Annual General Meeting of the Committee had taken place on 22 April 2026, at which the current Chairman, Councillor Gary Lee, Secretary, Mike Warrington and Treasurer, Mrs Rose Probert, had all been re-elected. Two new members were also welcomed to the Meeting.

She said that various projects and fundraising events had been discussed including:-

- Wooden Planters - Constructed and ready for installation at locations around the Village - Two now ready to be installed and planted up etc. - Council to be approached regarding obtaining the necessary permissions to site some of the planters on the public highway, and to also request that the watering of the planters be incorporated within the Council's current Contract with Ferring Nurseries - Hoping to install the first two, at least, by the end of May
- Bird Boxes, plaques, key fobs being made for the Committee by a volunteer
- Plant Sale outside of The Quill - 9 May 2026
- Summer planting of railing planters - North Lane
- Next Litter Pick in the Village Centre - 23 May 2026
- Clearance and planting of area under a tree near Churchill Court
- Pitch at Rustington Street Fayre - 11 July 2026

She concluded by saying that the Committee would be applying for a grant from the Parish Council for financial support towards various items, and possibly its Public Liability Insurance.

The Council NOTED this information.

109/26 **75TH ANNIVERSARY OF THE FESTIVAL OF BRITAIN MUSICAL CONCERT - 13 JUNE 2026**

The Clerk referred to Minute 44/26 and reminded Members that the Littlehampton Concert Band had agreed the draft programme for the Concert which, instead of focusing on the 'prom type' content, was a programme that celebrated British music more generally.

She said that the timing of the Concert would be from 2.30 pm to approximately 4.30 pm, with doors opening at 2.00 pm. She said that tickets for the Concert would be available from the Samuel Wickens Centre with effect from 1 May 2026, and Members would be contacted by email prior to the aforementioned date for their ticket requirements. She advised that the Concert would also be publicised on the Council's Facebook Page, the Website and on Village Notice Boards.

Cold soft drinks and refreshments would be being served to the seated audience during the interval and there would, as in previous Concerts, be a Free Lucky Programme Draw.

The Clerk also reported that following a request from the Compere of the Band, the Chairman had decided that although his chosen charity was The UK Sepsis Trust, Blind Veterans UK should be the recipient of the Retiring Collection on this occasion.

The Council was pleased to NOTE this information.

110/26 **CANCELLATION OF 2026 COMMUNITY CAROL CONCERT**

The Clerk said that as the Village Memorial Hall would be 'out of action' for the period from 21 September 2026 to 31 December 2026, it would be necessary for the current year's Event, scheduled to be held in the Hall on 12 December 2026, to be cancelled.

Following a brief discussion, the Council RESOLVED that an alternative venue within the Village should be sought that could accommodate the Carol Concert, but that if this proved to be impossible, it would have to be cancelled, with all participants being advised of the cancellation as soon as practicably possible.

The Clerk said that she would report back to the Council in this regard in due course.

111/26 CANCELLATION OF COUNCILLORS' SURGERY - THURSDAY 7 MAY 2026

The Clerk said that as the scheduled date for the next Surgery fell on the date of the County Council Elections, she had discussed the possibility of rescheduling it to Thursday 11 June 2026. She said that the Chairman had agreed to this change and the necessary arrangements had been made with the Library accordingly.

The Council NOTED this information.

112/26 FUTURE OF ZACHARY MERTON HOSPITAL AND LAND

The Chairman referred to Minute 79/26 and said that the Clerk had previously circulated correspondence between the Chairman of the Council and the Minister of State for Health, together with a copy of a letter to Mrs Alison Griffiths, MP, from Ms Siobhan Melia, Chief Executive, Sussex Community NHS Foundation Trust, in this regard.

The Clerk said that she had also circulated a joint Press Release received from Alison Griffiths, MP and the Chairman of the Council, inviting residents to a Public Meeting to be held in the Village Memorial Hall on Thursday 21 May 2026 from 6.00 pm to 7.30 pm. She advised that anyone wishing to attend and/or pose a question to the NHS representative, would have to do so by registering via the QR code, which would be able to be found on the front page of the next Council Newsletter which was due to be delivered to all households during the period commencing 4 May 2026, or by writing to the Parish Council, 34 Woodlands Avenue, Rustington, BN16 3HB, or registering at www.alisongriffiths.org.uk.

The Chairman then reported that Mrs Griffiths had now received a response from Karin Smyth, Health Minister, confirming that the Secretary of State was now considering calling-in the decision to close the Hospital. He said a Press Release had also been issued by Mrs Griffiths' Office, earlier that day.

The Clerk said that the Deputy Clerk and herself were liaising with Mrs Griffiths' Office on all matters associated with the Public Meeting and would be sharing any publicity/promotional material on the Council's Facebook Page and Website.

The Chairman said that it was of the utmost importance that the Public Meeting was well attended to fully demonstrate the level of concern and disappointment that the closure, and possible permanent loss of the Zachary Merton Hospital and Land, had had on the parishioners of Rustington and its neighbouring Town and Villages, and to call the Sussex Community NHS Foundation Trust and the Integrated Care Board to task in respect of the complete lack of public engagement and utter disregard for the general public.

The Council NOTED this information.

113/26 ARUN DISTRICT COUNCIL - LOCAL GOVERNMENT REORGANSATION - GOVERNMENT CONSULTATION - SHAPING WEST SUSSEX

The Council NOTED the latest information received via Dawn Hudd, Chief Executive, from the Government on 25 March 2026, as follows:-

We are writing to share the latest position regarding local government reorganisation in Sussex and Brighton following the update from government of 25 March.

West Sussex local authorities were expecting a decision on reorganisation in our area by the end of March.

The government has not yet made a decision on which unitary solution to apply in Sussex and instead have confirmed they will be running a second consultation on plans covering the whole of Sussex.

The new consultation will see two variations on the proposals already submitted by Sussex local authorities. The first proposed modification is moving Chichester District Council into a unitary with Crawley Borough Council, Horsham District Council and Mid Sussex District Council. Leaving a second unitary in West Sussex comprising Arun District Council, Adur District Council and Worthing Borough Council.

The second modification would see boundary changes moving wards in Falmer, Peacehaven and Saltdean from Lewes District Council in East Sussex to Brighton & Hove City Council.

This new consultation will begin after the local elections in May, and a decision is expected in the summer after the consultation period closes, and new representations are considered.

Your input into this consultation will help ensure that the implications for the communities you serve are fully considered by government. We will share more information on the consultation and further details as they become available.

The overall timescale for reorganisation remains the same with elections to the new shadow unitary authorities expected in 2027 preparing for the new authorities to formally launch in 2028.

114/26 ARUN DISTRICT COUNCIL - APPLICATION FOR PREMISES LICENCE - EXPRESS PIZZA RUSTINGTON LIMITED, 60 THE STREET, RUSTINGTON - LICENCE APPLICATION 123065

The Clerk said that she had previously circulated email correspondence from Environmental Health to Members, together with associated documentation in connection with an application for a Late-Night Refreshment Licence for Express Pizza Rustington Limited, 60 The Street, Rustington.

She reminded Members that the application related to Late Night Refreshment Takeaway Delivery Only as follows:-

Sunday to Thursday	23:00 to 02:00
Friday to Saturday	23:00 to 03:00

She advised that she had contacted the Licensing Officer for more information in respect of the proposed licensing hours and was advised as follows:-

'Under the Licensing Act 2003 anyone wanting to sell / supply hot food or drink after 11pm and before 5am must apply for a LNR licence. They can request what time they wish to operate and in this case the times of closure, 2am Sunday to Thursday and 3am Friday and Saturday were requested by the applicant.

In general terms these hours are not excessive, we have a number of such premises across the area with these and in some cases longer hours. In this case the applicant has also stated that during the night hours the premises will be operating on a delivery basis and not customer collection, to avoid excess noise/nuisance.'

Following a further discussion, the Council RESOLVED to make no comment to the District Council in respect of this Application.

**115/26 WEST SUSSEX COUNTY COUNCIL - RUSTINGTON GOLF CENTRE
ROUNDABOUT**

The Clerk reminded Members that she had previously circulated correspondence with Mark Jacobs, Area Highway Manager, Western Area, in respect of concerns raised by parishioners regarding the current operation of the Mill Lane/New Road Roundabout, which was extremely hazardous for motorists and pedestrians and, in the Council's opinion, was not fit for purpose.

In Mr Jacobs' response, he had advised that having reviewed the concerns raised by the Council, together with the available collision and speed data, the location would not currently be classified as a priority for the Road Safety Group (RSG). He continued by stating that the site had met the criteria to be included in an upcoming cluster site analysis, with records showing four slight collisions and one serious collision. However, the collision descriptions did not indicate a consistent pattern and most related to instances of dangerous or reckless driving.

He referred again to the upcoming analysis which would examine the site in more detail and stated that the RSG would be in a position to pursue further investigation should a clear and repeated pattern emerge. He assured the Council that the County Council would continue to monitor the situation and would provide an update if further information became available that could help address the concerns raised.

The Council NOTED this information.

116/26 RAMPION 2 WINDFARM STATUS EARLY 2026

The Clerk reminded Members that she had previously circulated an email received from the Secretary of The Littlehampton Society, together with a Press Release and associated documentation from the Secretary, Protect Coastal Sussex (PCS), in this regard.

The Council NOTED this information.
