Following months of negotiation, the Number 12 Bus Service will be reinstated from 4 September 2017, initially for a trial period of six months, during which time it is hoped that the funding can be secured from various sources to enable the service

to continue for the foreseeable future. The article below provides more detailed information regarding this service.

I would, at this point, like to remind everyone, that if they have good ideas for, or are unhappy with, any aspect of the Village, they should let the Council know. All Meetings are open to the Public with a Question Time taking place before the Meetings commence, and a quarterly Councillors' Surgery is held at the Public Library. I look forward to meeting many of you over the next year, and to seeing the amazing work you all do to keep Rustington the number one Parish in West Sussex.

No.12 Bus Service to be reinstated

The Parish Council and Compass Travel are very pleased to announce that with effect from 4 September 2017, the No. 12 Bus Route, which was withdrawn in April 2017, will be reinstated.

This is being done in response to many requests from members of the public, and with financial support from Rustington Parish Council, Rustington Chamber of Trade and Commerce and Store Property Investments Limited.

The service will initially operate from Monday to Friday between 10:00 and 15:00 hours. The route will, in the main, follow the original No. 12 route, serving Rustington Sainsbury's Superstore and Rustington Village Centre, with

the addition of the new Manor Retail Park and Worthing Road, Rustington. The service will then continue to Littlehampton, serving the Swimming and Leisure Centre, Littlehampton Railway Station and the Tesco Superstore at Broadpiece, Littlehampton.

The service is initially operating on a six month trial basis and its future will depend on it being well used and on sufficient funding being forthcoming from other parties. As well as standard fares, free travel is available with the Older Persons Bus Pass.

It is hoped that the major retailers benefiting from this bus service and other appropriate parties will be able to be

persuaded to commit financially, over the next few months, to ensure that the No. 12 route can continue after the trial period. To further secure the future of the No. 12 Bus Service, it is also most important that it is well-used by members of the public, as this will help to ensure its retention. So, please make use of the Service whenever you possibly can.

Enclosed with this Newsletter is a flyer which provides details of the timetable for the No. 12 Bus Service, together with the same for the recently introduced No. 15 Bus Service in Littlehampton.

Rustington-In-Bloom



Well another year on and it seems incredible that the judging day for the South & South-East in Bloom Competition has come and gone. Our Village again looked magnificent with all the glorious floral displays and everyone involved should feel very proud of presenting in the best possible way. We always have our fingers crossed with hope for a lovely Summer's day when the Judges arrive, and we were not let down this year, with some gentle overnight rain, it made the Village looking fresh and bright. Slight cloud and not too hot made for a pleasant day for the Judges, both seemed duly impressed as they walked through the Village Centre. Of course, it will not be until mid-September, that we shall know what they really felt about the Village.

With this year's theme of 'Turning Perennial', beds were changed over to perennials and the Rose Arch planted with butterfly and bee friendly plants to develop more sustainable planting in line with the Judges' comments of last year. The sculptured Wooden Soldier standing in a beautiful flower bed is still looking most impressive. The Soldier was sited in 2014 to commemorate the 100 Year Anniversary of the start of the First World War, and from the bright buttery yellow of three years ago, has now turned silvery grey of maturing oak with its cracks showing. A poignant reminder of the state of the War in 1917, a War of attrition, French troops in revolt, the influenza epidemic was taking its toll, the unrestricted U-boat was having a devastating effect on supplies, leading to the start of rationing, and the start of the third battle of Ypres. With a glimmer of hope of the Americans joining the War.

The Village Contractors, Ferring Nurseries, and especially Michael Harwood, David 'Courtenay' Luscombe and Joanne Crockford

have put in so much hard work and endeavour in making Rustington such an attractive and stunning Village all year. They all deserve a very big thank you for an outstanding effort for this year's In-Bloom entry.

The Committee is also delighted that there are now five groups who enter the South & South-East in Bloom 'It's Your Neighbourhood' Competition. In future years, it would be encouraging if other Neighbourhoods in the Village would decide to develop a small area to enhance that environment, not only for their pleasure but for others too. Those Neighbourhoods already involved find that there is a reduction in litter and graffiti, with respect for the area and for those who are involved in the work.

Our Village is looking beautiful with an amazing array of flowers giving pleasure to not only those of us who live here, but to visitors too.



We have two forthcoming fund-raising events, a Coffee and Cake Morning on 2 September 2017 in The Garden Room, behind the Museum at 76-78 The Street, and a Barn Dance on 23 September 2017 at The Woodlands Centre in Woodlands Avenue. So, if you have some spare time, please come along to one or both of these events to support the Committee's continuing efforts.



As 2018 fast approaches, it will hopefully be another year of celebrating and honoring the famous people and places of Rustington. This year, the Museum's Exhibition of the Zachary Merton Maternity Hospital, brought back many happy memories for our visitors, ex-staff, mothers and babies. A small Tea Party was held in The Garden Room on 10 July 2017, where the ex-staff members enjoyed cups of tea and cakes kindly sponsored by Sainsburys. Definitely a walk down Memory Lane.

2018 sees the Centenary of the death of Rustington's most famous Composer, Sir Hubert Parry. An Exhibition is planned to commemorate this event. Also, the Museum will be celebrating another Centenary, and a very important one at that, of women's right to vote in the Parliamentary Elections. Rustington boasted some highly acclaimed women of this movement.

This year has seen many activities in The Garden Room from Arts and Craft Workshops to private parties. It really is a lovely location with well-tended gardens thanks to Ferring Nurseries. It certainly has been a pretty picture during the Summer months. A great and safe picturesque setting for family gatherings and picnics.

Rustington Street Fayre

Do you remember Saturday 17 June when the sun shone all day and the 3rd Annual Street Fayre drew in record numbers of Charity Stalls and even more visitors.

The north service road was closed for the day and the Littlehampton District Lions Club managed to squeeze 36 Charity Stalls along Churchill Parade. At one end of The Street the stage was set up in the Methodist Church Garden and the Church Hall was filled with Arts & Crafts. At the other end of The Street, the Fun Fair drew in the crowds with squeals of excitement on the rides.

The stage had a full programme of both professional and amateur acts. The Magician and the Punch & Judy man enthralled the children and parents alike.

Many of the stalls had Tombolas, Face Painting and items for sale. The local First Responders were demonstrating resuscitation techniques. A number of the stalls, like the Parish Council's, were providing information and seeking interest in a variety of local issues (planning, flood

prevention and more). Some stalls were actively seeking new members and volunteers for their own causes.

The Lions' Club declared that the 2017 appeal would be in support of The Sussex Snowdrop Trust. As can be seen on the Trust's website, it helps terminally ill children (and their families), throughout our County.

In the Methodist Church Garden, the programme of entertainment focused on a range of professional and gifted amateur acts from the locality.

Visitors flocked to see the range of Arts & Crafts on display and for sale in the Church Hall.

As a result of the generosity of the public, the Lions' Club will soon be handing **The Snowdrop Trust** the proceeds of the event,



£2,000.00. Additionally, it is estimated that more than £5,000.00 was raised by the individual stalls for their own charitable organisations.

The Lions' Club would like to thank all of the sponsors and supporters without whose help this event could not proceed. Rustington Youth Club

The Youth Club is a venue for young people aged between 11 - 17 years. Open every Thursday evening during term time. It offers a variety of activities including pool, table tennis, air hockey, video games consoles, sports, art and more. Each week there is also a tuck shop and an ongoing programme including cooking, movie nights, inflatables, theme nights, and sports. This term we've made milkshakes and slushies, created speakers from paper cups, held our final inflatable and BBQ session and completed activities around risk taking behaviour using our own slackline. The programme is fun, varied, and young people have an active role in planning future sessions.

The Club is a partnership between Rustington Parish Council and ACCelerate - the youth work of Arun Community Church. The Youth Centre, where the Club takes place, is owned by the Parish Council and sited at the Woodlands Recreation Ground. The Centre was opened in 2004 as a venue for youth provision locally. ACCelerate took over running youth activities at the Centre in 2012 and has built a consistent relationship with many young people that have attended the Youth Club.

The session has a great team of staff and volunteers committed to seeing young people included and supported. The whole team is committed to making a difference to the lives of young people and is able to assess the needs of young people in order to plan and deliver programmes related to areas such as health, fitness, smoking, drugs, relationships and bullying. Since January the Youth Club has been run by a new Worker-in-Charge, Ben Burt. Ben has contributed a lot of volunteering hours for ACC over the past three years in various youth groups and has been a fantastic addition to the team.

The Youth Club is open from 6:00 pm to 8:00 pm (term time only with trips planned for half-terms) and the cost of entry is FREE for the first time, then 50p per session. You can also bring a friend to the Club that hasn't been before and you will BOTH get in for free that week.
