## Annual Civic Thanksgiving Service and Community Awards' Reception

The Parish Council hosted its Annual Thanksgiving Service on Sunday 8 September, at St Joseph's Roman Catholic Church.

Guests included Mrs Denise Patterson, Deputy Lieutenant of West Sussex, Mrs Davina Irwin-Clark, High Sheriff of West Sussex, Councillor Mrs Jeanette Warr, Chairman of the Arun District Council, and a number of other Chairmen, Mayors and Councillors from Bognor Regis, East Preston, Kingston, Littlehampton, Rustington, West Sussex County Council and the Arun District Council. The Service was conducted by Father Carl Davies.

Following the Service, the now well-established Community Awards' Reception was held at The Woodlands Centre, where presentations were made to various members of the community, both for outstanding floral displays in private front gardens and business premises and also for excellently cultivated allotment plots.

One of the highlights of the afternoon was the Presentation of the Parishioners' Award which was awarded to Matthew England, in recognition of his outstanding commitment to, and for the benefit of, the community of Rustington.



## Rustington Museum at the Samuel Wickens Centre



Rustington Museum is now officially open to the public! After a long wait, we are welcoming visitors through our doors. There is much to see and do in the new spaces from discovery stations, a children's trail, to a new Local Studies area. The Museum now has longer opening hours, Monday to Saturday, 9.00 am - 5.00 pm (closed 1.00 pm - 1.30 pm).

The permanent exhibition looks at Rustington's history dating back to the Stone Age. It continues through to the modern day, and on the way highlights the people and events which make Rustington's colourful history. There is also a second gallery and the first temporary exhibition focuses on Mary and Bev Taylor, who have done so much in recording the Village's history for many years.

The new season of events started with a family craft activity based on the Village's smuggling past, when children had the opportunity to make and take away their own secret hideaway for treasure. An exciting new programme of events for families at the Museum, is listed at the bottom of this article. The Museum will also be hosting a number of evening talks, based on themes from the collection and new displays, including the Romans, Historical Maps and even Science in the local area.

## Rustington-In-Bloom - Gold Awards and so much more...



I am delighted to be able to report that at the Annual Awards Ceremony for the South and South East in Bloom Competition in September, Rustington received yet another impressive set of results, with the Village receiving Gold Awards in both the Village/ Town Centre Category, and in the Park of the Year Category for the Woodlands Recreation Ground.

The judges feedback stated: 'This community really is the model for others to follow in terms of its commitment to the principles of South and South East in Bloom. A really impressive entry, organised and created by people who obviously care and are richly deserving of a Gold Award'. Rustington-in-Bloom was also the recipient

of the West Sussex Discretionary County Award for the entry with the highest marks.

In the 'Our Community' Category, the Rustington Methodist Church Garden received a Silver Gilt Award.

In the 'It's Your Neighbourhood' Category, The Chaucery Memorial, the Coastal Workshop, Oakhurst Gardens, and The Hidden Twitten each received 'Outstanding' Awards. Rustington Hall and Rustington Methodist Church Garden received 'Thriving' Awards and Oakhurst Gardens also received an RHS National Certificate of Distinction. The Brookside Memorial Garden Community Group was given an 'Advancing Award', which is most impressive as this project has come so far, transforming an all but forgotten burial ground into a remarkable special garden.

Such impressive and rewarding results for all involved!

Our community, once again, pulled out all the stops with its support for the In-Bloom Campaign, by helping to ensure that all areas of the judging criteria were met and exceeded and, in recognition of this, Certificates of Excellence were awarded to

a number of Groups, Clubs, Organisations and Individuals for their most important contributions towards the success. Congratulations to all.

As always, the Members of the In-Bloom Committee, in partnership with the Parish Council, organised the 2019 Campaign and were most grateful for the support of the Arun District Council Cleansing and Parks Department, together with other individual Officers from the District Council.

Special thanks and appreciation must be conveyed to Ferring Nurseries, without whose outstanding service, expertise and dedication, this remarkable success would most certainly not have been attained.

## Rustington Youth Club



At Rustington Youth Club (delivered by Arun Youth Projects), we are looking forward to celebrating the end of 2019 by exploring different themes over the next couple of months and moving into the new term.

November's theme is exploring 'Emotional Wellbeing' and December will be spent celebrating all things Christmassy!

We have had a new group of young people join us, and we always ensure that they feel welcomed and respected by all who attend.

The Club is open every Thursday evening from 7.00 pm - 9.00 pm, including half-terms and Summer holidays. It is a venue for young people aged between 11-17 years, to find help and advice, and a safe place to be, alongside access to games consoles, pool/table tennis, a chill-out space, and arts/crafts. Each week there is also a tuck shop and an ongoing programme including cooking, movie nights, inflatables, theme nights, and sports. The cost of entry is FREE for the first time, then 50p per session. You can also bring a friend to the Club that hasn't been before, and you will BOTH get in for FREE that week.

The Club is a partnership between Rustington Parish Council and Arun Youth Projects - the youth work of Arun Church. The Youth Centre, where the Club takes place, is owned by the Parish Council and sited at the Woodlands Recreation Ground. Arun Youth Projects took over running youth activities at the Centre in 2012 and has built a consistent relationship with many young people that have attended. The Club has a great team of staff and volunteers committed to seeing young people included and supported and to making a difference to their lives by assessing their needs in order to plan and deliver programmes related to areas such as health, fitness, smoking, drugs, relationships and bullying.
